

New Dimensions

The Leipzig String Quartet on MDG has celebrated major triumphs with Schubert, Brahms, and Beethoven ... and Mozart is next. The competition can envy but not match this ensemble opening up "new dimensions" (FonoForum) with its "simply delightful" interpretations (Classic CD).

Haydn on Mozart

The "Haydn Quartets" KV 387 and 421 are by Mozart and were performed at his home in the Große Schulerstr. No. 846 in Vienna in 1785. The strict teacher whose name they bear was in attendance and wrote to the twenty-seven-year-old composer's father. "I say to you before God, your son is the greatest composer I know." Haydn was almost rendered speechless.

Critical Hearing

As enthusiastic as Haydn himself may have been, Vienna critics received Mozart's quartets with skepticism. Mozart's clear and deliberate departure from banal divertimento bowing-and-fingering meant for one critic that he "presuming too much," and another heard in the quartets "music for holding one's ears."
