



# Marriage Bells

## WEDDING HANSEN-WHARFE

In view of the extreme popularity of the contracting parties, considerable local interest was manifested in the wedding of Mr. Frederick T Hansen, second son of Mr. H. The important ceremony was celebrated at St. Mary's Cathedral, Sydney, on Monday morning, and the officiating clergyman was the Rev. Fr. Brosnan, an old and particular friend of the bridegroom's family, it being his last clerical act prior to his departure this week for the old country. The pretty bride, who was given away by Mr. Blackwell, an old friend, was becomingly gowned in a beautiful costume of ivory silk crepe radium, with hand-embroidered panels and deep silk fringe, a soft satin hat of ivory shade completing her toilet.
