We hope to see more classes joining them next term! Attendance continues to be a high priority at Limehurst. We regularly review your child's attendance and where there is a concern we will get in touch. We have a graduated response that means we will send letters, invite you to attendance panels and may issue Penalty Notices (fines). We work closely alongside Oldham Council Attendance Service to ensure as many children as possible are in school every day.

Our school's current overall attendance percentage is 93%. This is below local and national averages – Oldham's primary school average is 94.1% and the National average is 94.4%.

Punctuality also Matters!

The focus for our Spring term newsletter is 'punctuality' and reducing the number of lates ...

We have seen an increase in the number of children regularly arriving late for school and entering via the school office. It is very important that your child is on time at the start of each day, if they arrive once their classroom door is closed, they will be given an 'L' mark for arriving late whilst the register is still open. The registers close at 9.20am, if your child arrives after this time they will be marked as a 'U' for unathorised late. This code covers the entire morning session and will affect your child's attendance record.

So far, this academic year we have recorded **828** 'L' marks and **184** 'U' marks. Being a 'little bit late' may not seem much but ...
