## Dear Parent/carer,

Please find details of some of the main reports and 'other' relevant information at Limehurst and the wider Community. This also includes information in regard Oldham 'winter' support packages:

## Hate incidents, hate harassment, and hate crime.

## It is with great sadness and disappointment that I have to detail a report of a hate incident that has taken place on the school grounds.

I take this opportunity to remind parents and carers that Limehurst is a Multicultural School. We provide multicultural education which is a set of educational strategies developed to provide pupils with knowledge about the histories, cultures, and contributions of diverse groups. At Limehurst we celebrate difference and condemn ALL forms of hate, as defined below:

# A hate crime is any behaviour that someone thinks was caused by hostility, prejudice, or hatred of:

- Disability (including physical impairments, Mental Health problems, learning disabilities, hearing, and visual impairment)
- Gender identity (people who are transgender, transsexual or transvestite)
- Race, skin colour, nationality, ethnicity, or heritage
- Religion, faith, or belief (including people without a religious belief)
- Sexual Orientation (people who are lesbian, gay, bisexual or heterosexual)
- Alternative Subculture/ Lifestyle (the way a person looks or dresses) Groups that are described as subcultures often include punk rockers, ravers, metalheads, goths, emo and indie.

There are lots of several types of hate crimes. These could include:

- Physical attacks such as physical assault, damage to property, offensive graffiti, neighbour disputes, and arson.
- Threat of attack including offensive letters, abusive or obscene telephone calls or text messages, groups hanging around to intimidate and unfounded, malicious complaints.















• Verbal abuse or insults – offensive leaflets and posters, abusive gestures, offensive and derogatory comments, and/or name calling, dumping of rubbish outside homes or through letterboxes and bullying at school or in the workplace.

A victim is any person who is subjected to a hate motivated incident or crime. A victim is also someone who witnesses another person being subjected to a hate motivated incident or crime.

A perpetrator or offender is any person who commits acts of hatred against other people because of their race, colour, ethnic origin, nationality, faith or religion, age, gender, sexuality, or disability.

We state in the strongest possible terms. Limehurst will not tolerate hate in any of its guises. All hate incidents, incidents of hate harassment and hate crimes will be reported to the appropriate bodies, including the Police.

A phrase that we use in school may be pertinent: if you have nothing nice to say, just say nothing.

## You can report a hate crime to any of these agencies:

Police

- Emergency: In an emergency you should phone 999
- Non-emergency: You can phone Greater Manchester Police on 101 or you can go to any police station.

If you do not want to call the police or if you want extra support, you can call the Stop Hate Helpline.

Oldham Council are seeking to recruit a group of residents that are representative of the population of Oldham.

## How does it work?

Every so often, you will be contacted to take part in a brief survey, telephone interview, or face-to-face focus group. They will ask you a few questions about your priorities, your views, and experiences, and the kinds of services and support you access in the local area.

The information received is collated and analysed to understand how residents feel about a particular issue. You will remain anonymous and will not be identified in any way.

A report that details all the information and views residents have shared is shared with the relevant service area. This will be crucial in helping to inform their decisions.

## 'Welcome to our building'

We remind all parents and carers of our 'Welcome to our building' statement. We welcome visitors to our building and act to ensure it remains a safe place for staff and other members of our community. We trust that our respect and politeness will be returned.

However, should anyone act in abusive or threatening manner they will be required to leave the building. Further action will be taken and may result in a banning order or Police prosecution.
