Geography- At Limehurst, we believe that becoming a geographer enables a child to develop a fundamental understanding of themselves and their place in our world. Geography inspires in pupils a curiosity and fascination about the world and its people. Pupils will develop knowledge about diverse places, people, resources, plus natural and human environments. Through their work in Geography, children learn about their local area and compare this with other regions of the United Kingdom and the rest of the world. There is a focus on location and place knowledge as well as geographical skills such as using maps, atlases and globes. Their growing knowledge and understanding of human geography will help children to gain an appreciation of life in other cultures. In addition, children will study a variety of physical features using subject specific vocabulary.
