 - 6) If you don't have a car pickup tag, write your last name on a piece of paper and put it in the front passenger side of the car so that it is easily readable. If you need another tag, please let me know. For safety purposes, you should always enter the carline from the parking lot off, **not** from the street in front of the school.

- 7) The newsletter is published weekly to provide important information to you about 2nd grade. Please check the website and read the newsletter every week.
- 8) A dismissal form was handed out at the parent meeting. Please send all forms to school ASAP. If you misplaced them, please check the class webpage for addition copies. They will be on the "school information" page.
- 9) If sending a water bottle, don't forget it should be a sweat proof water bottle, already filled with water,

Kids seem to have a repertoire of "hooks" they use to get their parents to argue with them. Here are some Love and Logic One-Liners that will get parents off the hook and cause children to do more of the thinking. Remember: The "one-liners" are only effective when said with genuine compassion and understanding. These are never intended to be flippant remarks that discount the feelings of the child. If an adult uses these responses to try to get the better of a child, the problem will only become worse. The adult's own attitude at these times is crucial to success. "Probably so." "Nice try." "Bummer. How sad." "Don't worry about it now."

"I bet it feels that way." "What do you think you're going to do." "That's an option."

"I don't know. What do you think?" "What do you think I think about that?":"I know."

"Thanks for sharing that." "I bet that's true." "I'll love you wherever you live."

"Maybe you'll like what we have for the next meal better."

"I'll let you know what will work for me."
